First Reading: Deuteronomy 30:10-14

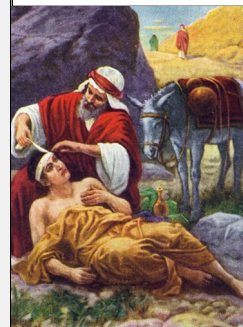
Response: Turn to the Lord in your need, and you will live.

Who is your neighbour?

Through Moses, the commandments of loving God and one's neighbour was given.

These rules were given to protect the vulnerable, give guidance in behaviour and make and keep peace. Most of us keep the commandments and are faithful to the teachings. Jesus message

goes further— live life to the full by getting outside ourselves to practise compassion and service for others.

In the passage from Deuteronomy, they recognise humans making mistakes, seeking pardon, but don't commit to making changes. We need to immerse in the spirit totally not half-heartily to get the abundance in life—commit to change.

In the Gospel of Luke to Good Samaritan parable is mentioned. The Samaritan is filled with compassion for the Jew. The mixed race Samaritans are despised by Jews and the feelings are mutual. Jesus is telling us not to have boundaries with others in the human race, show dignity and exercise respect to everyone in our daily life. So love your neighbour, who ever they are, as you love the Lord, your family and yourselves.
