Entrance Antiphon: Within your will, O Lord, all things are established, and there is none that can resist your will. For you have made all things, the heaven and the earth, and all that is held within the circle of heaven; you are the Lord of all.

First Reading: Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4

Second Reading: 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! The word of the Lord stands forever; it is the word given to you, the Good News. Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 17:5-9

Communion Antiphon: The Lord is good to those who hope in him, to the soul that seeks him.

Steadfast Faith.

Today's reading is about having faith in God, no matter what the situation we are in. In the first reading, the prophet Habakkuk is questioning God about the way he is running the world! Habakkuk sees the rampant injustice not been punished for their evil and the oppressed not being released from their terrible situation. The Lord tells him, that the wrong doers will not have a peace-filled relationship with God, while the faithful and trusting in God will live life to its fullest, and not to mention eternal happiness.

In the second letter of St Paul to Timothy, St Paul teaches us to never be ashamed of witnessing to the Lord. Faith is persistence in reaching out to Jesus and trusting in God's power and authority. Faith is responding with love to forgiveness received. Faith is giving praise to God, having confidence in God's desire for justice and being willing to ask Jesus for what we need.

In the Gospel, the disciples wanted to increase their faith. The essence of faith is a deep trust in God, and that our trust in God can grow, which it seemed that the disciples lacked. If we have some faith, than that is better to have than none at all.

When we say Amen, we affirm our support to Jesus's teachings and our trust in God that everything happens for a reason.
