The Most Holy Trinity 4th June 2023 YEAR A

Entrance Antiphon: Blest be God the Father, and the Only Begotten Son of God, and also the Holy Spirit, for he has shown us his merciful love.

First Reading: Exodus 34:4-6, 8-9

Response: Glory and praise for ever!

Second Reading: Corinthians 13:11-13

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia! Glory to the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit: to God who is, who was, and who is to come. Alleluia!

Gospel: John 3:16-18

Communion Antiphon: Since you are children of God, God has sent into your hearts the Spirit of his Son, the Spirit who cries out: Abba, Father.



The Most Holy Trinity.

The feast honour the Blessed Trinity was established by Pope John XXII (1316-1334) for the Sunday after Pentecost. Describing God as a Trinity is an expression of a uniquely Christian experience of God. The followers of Jesus understood that God was communicated to humanity via Jesus as a human form of God,

Jesus also referred to being the Son of God as mentioned in the Liturgy after Easter, so God the Father and last week when we celebrated the coming of the Holy Spirit, we celebrated the gift of God in the Spirit.

In the first reading from the book of Exodus, God restores the covenant between Himself and the people of Israel. God is forgiving and loving even after the Israelites began to worship a golden calf. The 2 new stone tablets handed to Moses contain the condition of the covenant in order to remain faithful to God and the rest deals with our relationship with other humans. We honour God by honouring the person standing before us. In the second letter of St Paul to the Corinthians, Paul is urging the community members to live in peace and to strive for unity. By being one with Jesus, we are graced with God and the Holy Spirit. In the Gospel according to John, it reaffirms God's love for us, that he sent His Son, in His image, to save us, by teaching us to live, love and grow with our Christian values and faith. This offer to be a member and be saved is one too good to refuse.

About the Redemptoris Mater Seminary & Fr Eric.

In 2015 there was an article in Catholic Weekly about the Redemptoris Mater Seminary and the good works of Fr Eric.

In summary—In 1987 Eric Skruzny joined the inaugural class of Seminarians at the worlds first Redemptoris Mater (Mother of the Redeemer) seminary in Rome. In the same year, a small church and shrine dedicated to the Virgin Mary on Gurney Rd, with declining congregation prayed for the future of it's parish in Chester Hill. Then in 2001, Archbishop George Pell, invited the Neocatechumenal Way—a cultural and liturgical movement of John Paul II, to establish a seminary in the Archdiocese of Sydney. In 2012, after 4 years of building, the Seminary on this site in Chester Hill officially opened. CWF appeals assist in the operating of the Seminary.

Fr Eric is still the rector for the seminary.

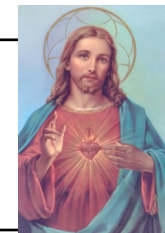
Save the Date: Walk With Christ- Sunday 11 June
